

Dear Readers,

It is with great satisfaction that we begin the publications for the year 2026, following the completion of the continuous issue for 2025, as well as the release of the special issue dedicated to the **I Seminário Interdisciplinar de Filosofia e Psicopatologia Fenomenológica: Reexaminando o Desenvolvimento Subjetivo Adulto**. Beyond the public opening of our editorial activities, we emphasize that our work is already underway on several fronts, in step with the issue we now present.

In the wake of the **internationalization process** of *Revista Psicopatologia Fenomenológica Contemporânea*, we welcome the return of our founding editor, Prof. Dr. Guilherme Messas, to a closer and more active role within the current editorial board. It should be noted that his reintegration into this collective project represents a fundamental step in strengthening and expanding the journal globally, as well as in broadening the space for Phenomenological Psychopathology and qualitative research in Psychopathology in both national and international contexts.

This movement toward the dissemination and consolidation of the phenomenological field is also expressed in the recent realization of two interdisciplinary collaborative events: the **II Seminário Interdisciplinar de Filosofia e Psicopatologia Fenomenológica: Pessoa e Adoecimento**, hosted at the Faculdade de Filosofia, Letras e Ciências Humanas da USP (FFLCH-USP) and coordinated by Profs. Guilherme Messas (FCMSCSP) and Marcus Sacrini (FFLCH-USP); and the **Summer School**, hosted at the Faculdade de Ciências Médicas da Santa Casa de São Paulo, the result of a partnership between the institution itself, the Sociedade Brasileira de Psicopatologia Fenômeno-Estrutural (SBPFE)—the maintaining entity of our journal—and the Values Based Practice Centre at St Catherine's College, Oxford. It is worth emphasizing that these events brought together leading figures in their respective fields, both nationally and internationally, each within its thematic focus and specific scope. Both meetings will result in the timely publication of special issues of the journal, thereby continuing an editorial tradition that we have cultivated in recent years.

In the 2026 agenda, we will also publish a special issue composed of the proceedings of the **III Simpósio Internacional de Psicopatologia Fenomenológica**, held in 2025 in Fortaleza and organized jointly by SBPFE and the Laboratório de

Psicopatologia e Clínica Humanista-Fenomenológica (APHETO), as well as a collection of original articles, in bilingual format, developed from presentations delivered at the event. Our intention is for this issue to be released on the occasion of the **XIII Simpósio de Psicopatologia Fenomenológica da SBPFE**, to be held on August 8 in São Paulo—thus reinforcing the institutional and scientific character that resonates throughout the recent trajectory of our field.

We understand, therefore, that the year 2026 will mark an important cycle for the Brazilian phenomenological community, as well as for *Revista Psicopatologia Fenomenológica Contemporânea*. Accordingly, we will seek to accompany this movement with commitment and seriousness, presenting and strengthening—through the publication of original and distinguished manuscripts, as well as through the promotion of academic and interdisciplinary encounters—the construction of critical and forward-looking dialogues in Phenomenology, in Phenomenological Psychopathology, and in the Humanities more broadly.

Finally, but no less importantly, we thank all those involved in the production of the journal—in particular SBPFE, for its investment in the realization of this project; our technical team; our authors; and our readers.
